IBPSA'S BUILDING SIMULATION '89 CALL FOR PAPERS

Building Simulation '89 is a two-day conference providing an opportunity to exchange ideas on the latest research results, advances in software development and integration, and other aspects of simulation of building and building component performance. The program will focus on both computer code development and research and on user applications of building simulation tools.

CALL FOR PAPERS AND SOFTWARE DEMONSTRATIONS

The conference will provide a forum for the dissemination of information generated from the latest activities in computerized building simulation. IBPSA is asking you to consider contributing to the information exchange. There are two ways to do this:

- 1. Present a formal paper at the Conference
- 2. Demonstrate new software or an interesting application of existing software. Demonstrators will be required to bring their own hardware.

SUGGESTED TOPICS FOR PAPERS

Papers must focus on simulation or on topics related to simulation. Specific areas include:

- Energy-related building performance
- Lighting
- Acoustics
- Computer-aided design
- Knowledge-based design methods
- Thermal storage
- Heat pumps

- Ergonomics
- Code verification procedures
- Building maintenance
- User/occupant performance response
- Reduction of building first costs
- Traffic flow
- Controls
- Diagnostics
- Monitoring focusing on analysis methods
- Indoor air quality

Since only the best contributed papers can be accepted, the following criteria will be applied for evaluating abstracts:

- Coherence with conference objectives
- Focus on new material. Presentation of old material without a significantly new interpretation is inappropriate
- Readability of the paper, including its organization and clarity
